Coping with the trauma of abuse, abandonment and her parents' addiction, Amanda began using drugs as a teenager and "looking for love and affection in places I didn't belong."

Over the years, her selfdestructive lifestyle only led to greater heartbreak: dysfunctional relationships... separation from her children... and time behind bars.

But incarceration was a blessing in disguise, because while in jail she learned about God. Now longing to build a new life in Christ, she came to Buffalo City Mission upon her release.

In our care, "I've learned about the Holy Spirit... about the Bible... and how to pray," she says. With the guidance and compassion of our counselors, she's also healing by the grace of God's love. "I can tell because I'm at peace."

Through classes and jobskills training, she's building confidence for her future, and recently completed certification to become a peer advocate. Just as important, she has reconnected with her children.

Today, as she continues her walk with the Lord, "I'm learning to look at myself the way God sees me," she says, "and not the way I used to see myself."
